

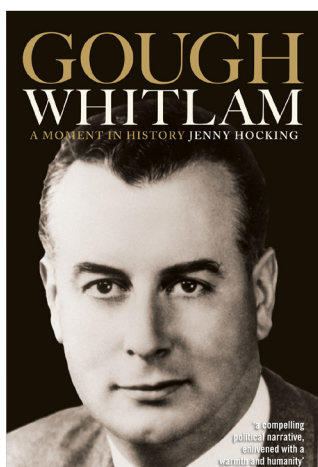

Following on from its 2008 success, MUP are proud to announce the release of Jenny Hocking's *Gough Whitlam: A Moment in History* in paperback.

This acclaimed biography is the first contemporary and definitive study of the former Labor Prime Minister.

From his childhood in the fledging city of Canberra to his first appearance as Prime Minister (playing Neville Chamberlain), to his extensive war service in the Pacific and marriage to Margaret, the champion swimmer and daughter of Justice Wilfred Dovey, the biography draws on previously unseen archival material, extensive interviews with family and colleagues, and exclusive interviews with Gough Whitlam himself.

Hocking's narrative skill and scrupulous research reveals an extraordinary and complex man, whose life is, in every way, formed by the remarkable events of previous generations of his family, and who would, in turn, change Australian political and cultural developments in the twentieth century.

Jenny Hocking is Research Professor in the National Centre for Australian Studies at Monash University. She is the author of two major political biographies, *Lionel Murphy: A Political Biography*, shortlisted in the South Australian Festival Awards for Literature: National Non-Fiction Awards, and *Frank Hardy: Politics Literature Life*, shortlisted in the NSW Premier's History Awards.

Jenny has also written extensively on counter-terrorism and democracy, most recently in *Terror Laws: ASIO, Counter-terrorism and the Threat to Democracy*.
