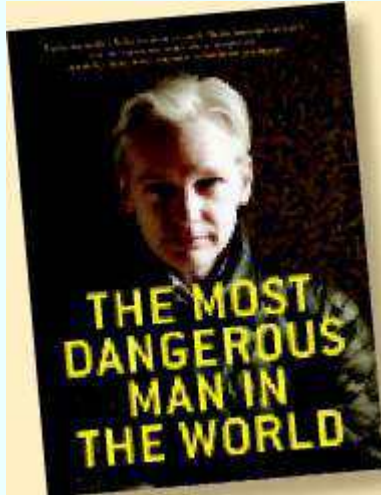

Andrew Fowler is the head of the ABC's investigative journalism unit, and a contributing reporter for the ABC's Foreign Correspondent and Four Corners programs. He has been Chief-of-Staff and Acting Foreign Editor of The Australian and a reporter with SBS Dateline and Channel 7, and was a founding member of Lateline in 1990. Andrew has won several awards including the United Nations Peace Prize, the Human Rights Award, and a New York Festival silver medal.
