Great Australian Sporting Moments

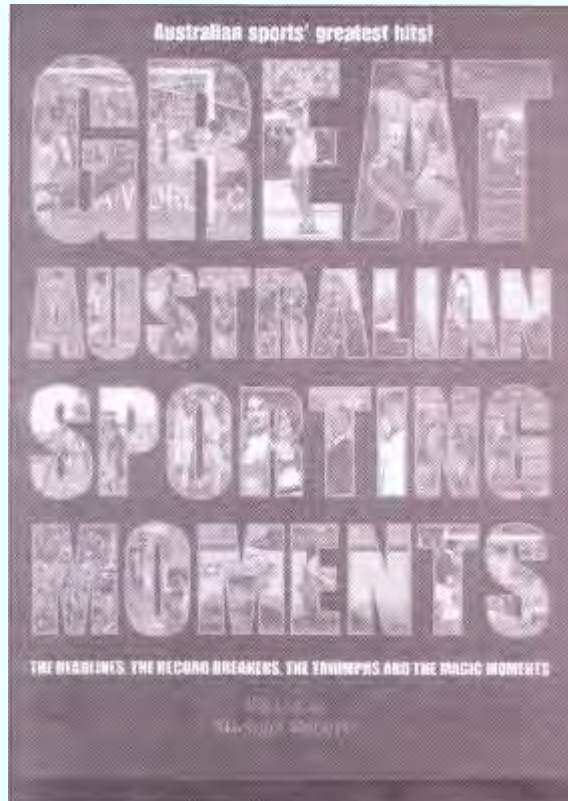
